## **September Housing Starts Up 32% Significant Increase in Multiple Housing Starts in Toronto**

**October 9, 2007 - Toronto, ON** - "Home builders across Ontario experienced a strong rebound in construction activity this September," stated Ontario Home Builders' Association President Mark Basciano. "The most notable increase was observed in the multi-family sector of the housing market, especially in Toronto," said Basciano, who added, "condo sales in the Toronto region are moving along at a record pace, these sales are now moving into the construction phase which is now being reflected in the housing starts being reported."

Basciano noted, "Affordability remains a concern as the new housing market is down by 9% through the first three quarters of 2007 despite a very strong September. Economists are forecasting that the Bank of Canada will hold rates steady with the possibility of a 25 basis point decrease prior to the end of 2007. On the downside, the Ontario Home Builders Association remains very concerned with what we see is an unacceptably high land transfer tax being considered by the City of Toronto. Builders are fundamentally opposed to another land transfer tax in Toronto because this would be devastating to housing affordability and to one of the few industries currently thriving in the city. New taxes are not the answer."

The 2007 September Ontario preliminary housing starts were up 32% compared to September 2006 according to numbers released by the Canada Mortgage and Housing Corporation this morning. Single detached housing starts in Ontario dropped by 3%, while the more volatile multi-unit housing starts experienced a very significant increase of 94%. Overall new housing starts have declined by 9% for the first three quarters of 2007. Earlier in the year, the Ontario Home Builders' Association revised its 2007 housing starts forecast down to 67,000 from 69,000 (there were 73,417 housing starts in 2006).
